Five interrelated issues

- Climate change extreme events some scientists say just 34 months before a tipping point *
- Peak everything not just Oil which made our extraordinary way of life possible
- We are damaging the ecosystem on which all life depends air, soil, forests, oceans and other living things
- Poverty and economic injustice
- Violence, war and terrorism

Folly

Ecocide = extensive damage to, destruction or loss of ecosystems

- Canada's Alberta Tar Sands produce 4 times more greenhouse gas emissions than conventional oil extraction ... Uses enough natural gas to heat three million Canadian homes....
- Pacific Trash Vortex 100 million tonnes of floating rubbish polluting sea and coastlines
- •100 species become extinct every day
- •Amazon forest: an area equal to 50 football pitches has been destroyed every minute since 2000. The total loss is 10 times the area of the UK (guardian. com, Friday 15 November)

But many of us prefer to not think about the human impact on our planet.






Our failure to live in harmony with Mother Earth and all life, including each other

Open cast mining in Indonesia, destruction of forests - displacing native peoples, Pacific Trash Vortex – 100 million tonnes of floating rubbish, oil from tar sands in Canada, gas from "Fracking" – just puts off the day









We're warming up the planet and getting fatter and unhealthier



- Air pollution causes 29,000 early deaths a year in the UK more than obesity and alcohol combined.(ClientEarth)
- Sitting in cars and at computers, instead of walking and cycling
- Eating more energy than we burn up and the wrong food = 25% obese, 64% overweight in UK - Costs NHS half its budget

Spiralling inequality: The rich are getting richer; the rest are getting poorer

The wealth of the world's 475 billionaires is now worth the combined income of the bottom half of humanity





London is the most unequal city in the Western world

Richest tenth of the population own 273 times the wealth owned by the

bottom tenth - around the same levels as the beginning of the 19th century

Insanity

Instead of dealing with the biggest threat to humanity, Governments are fixated on economic growth

When

- Climate action is urgent
- We're already consuming 30% too much and our consumption is rising
- Population estimated to grow from 7bn to 9bn by 2050
- Poor countries' expectations are rising

Current orthodoxy defies common sense

- Continuous growth on a Finite Planet
- Consume more and more to be happy and provide jobs
- Paradoxically Cuts = more distress, lost jobs, insecurity, more spent on benefits, less tax revenue and more debt

An unsustainable global economic system

- Fuels climate chaos
- Systematically transfers wealth from the 99% to the 1%. Bears down on the rest of us people who make things, serve and feed us
- Taxpayers subsidise Big Cos, banks, landlords and employers who are not paying enough through subsidies, bail outs and tax credits.
- Big Cos above all oil, autos, superstores, energy and agribusiness have to much power- they hi-jack national governments and global institutions and "externalise" costs
- Mono-thinking, mono-culture, mono-crops, mono-everything, "clone towns" when diversity is vital
- Our security and sovereignty at the mercy of global markets
- Supported by war and huge military economy = lives lost; \$ trillions that could be better spent

Essentially we're "colonised"



What drives the system

"When the capital development of a country becomes a by-product of a casino, the job is likely to be ill-done" John Maynard Keynes

- "Neo-Liberal Ideology" free market economy; privatisation; austerity
- Cuts and "structural adjustment" didn't work in poor countries why would it work for us?
- Growth Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is not a measure of progress or real wealth Short-termism
- Free Trade in pursuit of lowest cost damages economies, communities, jobs, security and sovereignty, "all roads lead to the ports"
- Debt Money money created through debt the need to pay interest and repay debt fuels unsustainable growth

The solutions are known. So what obstructs change?

Lack of Political Leadership – Economically illiterate Policy Makers

•Governments lack political will, vision and long-term strategy – in the grip of funding/lobbying; short term focus; tomorrow's news; next election

Failing to provide enabling strategy for business

- Economically illiterate view that personal debt and national debt are the same thing In a depression the job of the state is to invest
- •Out dated democracy unfair voting system; unrepresentative parliament disenfranchises us Adversarial politics polarised
- Centralised power, big solutions, big tech, centralised decision making instead of subsidiarity (getting things done at the right level), local power and releasing creativity
- Irresponsible media unbalanced, confuses, distracts, misleads
- Disempowered citizens angry, frustrated, cynical, perception of low standards in public life, retreat from political participation, especially amongst young "nothing we can do"

Money, financial markets and taxation

The process by which banks create money is so simple that the mind is repelled. J K Galbraith

- Debt Money 97% of our money created by banks "out of thin air" for profit;
 causes housing inflation; everything costs more
- Creates massive debt burden for nation, people especially young and poor people and poor countries
- Unstable financial markets 90% transactions are speculative
- Lack of regulation and due diligence = subprime crisis, credit crunch, recession, bailouts - the taxpayer pays
- Perverse taxation, enormous hidden subsidies for Big Cos and banks-rewards the unsustainable; fails to reward sustainable enterprise
- Vast tax avoidance and evasion UK tax havens, laundering, corruption and abdication of social responsibility


The Alternative

A Global Economy whose purpose is the Wellbeing of all, including all life on the planet

Wellbeing

Happier countries are green, yellow middling; least happy are brown (New Economics Foundation (nef) Happy Planet Index)

Denmark is the happiest – community matters most, 50% tax but free education, university, child care and healthcare (UN World Happiness Report 2012)



Polly Higgins's UN Ecocide Law 5th Crime against Peace

- •A 5th crime under the Rome Statute primary duty protect people and planet first
- •Stewardship will become the number one priority ownership secondary
- •International Criminal Court (ICC) Starting point is restoration. Where member state is either unwilling or unable to act, the ICC will step in
- •Legally binding duty of care 5 years transition from "polluter pays" to "polluter doesn't pollute"
- Companies, banks and governments responsible for restoring adversely impacted territories
- Ultimately enforced by minimum two years imprisonment alternative sentencing option restorative justice; hearing to come to agreement with parties adversely affected



A Great Transition – Green New Deal (New Economics Foundation – nef)

- Green the economy Double win preventing environmental catastrophe and creating good work and prosperity - the way out of depression
- New values not stuff, power and status but what matters most. Respect for nature and One World
- Steady State Economy "prosperity without growth"
- Consume less! "Contraction and Convergence" Rich "West" contracts carbon rationing.
- Cut burning of fossil fuels; leave them in the ground. Converge to equal per capita footprint gradual transition. Concentrate trade on the highest FEET index *
- Rebalance the Economy and Invest service sector is ¾ of British economy; North/
- Cut military expenditure spend on preventing war and resolving violent conflict. Nuclear weapons cost £3BN per annum – enough to quadruple investment in green energy
- * Foreign Exchange Earnings per Transport tonne (FEET index)

Multiple Renewable Solutions - Sustainable Energy Networks

- Power output from renewables can be highly variable so a combination of different sources and storage is needed
- Wind, wave, tide, hydro, solar, solar PV, ground, water, nuclear(do we really want this?), air source heat pumps, energy storage, biomass, waste reduction. Sustainable Energy without the hot air David Mackay and Zero Carbon Britain Centre for Alternative Technology (CAT)
- •Regional Energy Networks to develop a network to bring together energy knowhow and research programs through better coordination and exploitation of research – e.g. The European North Sea Energy Alliance (ENSEA) Scotland, Norway, Northern Germany and Northern Netherlands http://www.ensea.biz/
- Will help achieve the European Union's 20.20.20 climate and energy goals and sustainable growth



Monetary Reform James Robertson and Ben Dyson

- Central Bank creates money, debt free = £60bn a year saving for taxpayer, lower inflation & lower costs (Positive Money campaign)
- Banks re-define roles, more choice, break oligopoly
- Regulate markets food and commodity speculation Tobin Tax
- Sustainable taxation: reward the sustainable; tax "harms"; end Avoidance and Evasion
- Tackle excessive top pay based on short term yields
- Living wage currently taxpayers subsidise employers paying low wages
- Citizens Income a right, everyone including students and pensioners ending dependency – would probably costs less

Monetary Reform James Robertson and Ben Dyson

- Give Independent commission sole responsibility for creating money, debt free, to meet national objectives = £60bn a year saving for taxpayer, lower inflation & lower costs
- Banks re-define roles: investment banks, "boring" banks; national, regional, local banks and break oligopoly
- Regulate markets food and commodity speculation; Tobin tax on transactions
- Sustainable taxation: Reward sustainable enterprise; Tax "harms": Carbon Tax;
 end avoidance and evasion
- Citizens Income a right, everyone including students and pensioners ending dependency; costs less. Land Value Tax sharing nation's common wealth
- Tackle excessive top pay transparency, maximum pay ratios, supervisory boards, active shareholders
- Living wage taxpayers currently subsidise employers paying low wages

We're taking far more than our share

- We are consuming 130% (rising) of the earth's bio-capacity, wasting it massively; 7bn of us now; estimated 9bn by 2050; demand for power to rise 53% by 2030 unless we become more efficient and waste less
- Eco-footprints: LA rate = 5 planets; London = 3. Hectares per person: US 12.2 UK 6.29 (really double that), India 1.06. Safe, fair target 1.8 by 2050
- Carbon footprints CO2 tonnes p.p. p.a. : Qatar 44, US 17.2, UK 10 (double that because we have exported our dirty jobs), India 1.4, China 5.3, most African countries below 1. (Wikipedia 2009) Safe 2050 target for planet 2 tonnes p.p. = 90% reduction for us
- Real costs of oil and cheap everything ="externalised costs" a billion are hungry, a billion overweight, wars too
- Wars in Iraq and Afghanistan thousands killed, millions injured or displaced. Created and almost half the world's 11 million refugees. More money needs to go into prevention and research
- Climate change kills 300,000 p.a. in poor countries
- Misdirected spends research goes into what makes money; not prevention of climate change, wars, harms and disease

Deaths from war and road crashes

- 1.2bn war deaths since 1700
- 40m 1945 to 2000
- War in Iraq and Afghanistan thousands killed, injured or displaced, almost half the world's 11 million refugees created and ruined lives
- Annual road deaths now around 2m, 300,00 children, predominantly in poor countries, highest amongst young men, similar to those in war and conflict. Expected to rise to 3.6m by 2030 exceeding those from war and conflict. Source World Health Organisation
- Our nuclear weapons cost £3bn a year enough to quadruple investment in Renewable energy Campaign Against Arms Trade CAAT
